The fleshy part of a plant than can be eaten by humans and animals.

These anchor a plant in the soil and suck up nutrients (food) and water.

A plant grows from this fleshy object when it is placed into soil. An onion is an example of this.

Found in fruits, these small objects can grow into plants. They can also be eaten by humans and animals.

Using Osric's Bingo card generator it is quick and easy to make a set of randomly generated vocabulary bingo cards. The website allows a user to control the number of words (you can also have pictures instead of words) on each card as well as how many cards to print.

The practitioner also needs to create a set of definitions for each piece of vocabulary.

## Playing the game:

- 1. Give each child one card. Some EAL learners, particularly those newer to English, could be buddied up with a supportive peer
- 2. The practitioner draws definitions randomly one by one
- 3. Pupils mark off vocabulary when they hear it being defined
- 4. The winner is the first pupil to mark off all their words
