

Scrambling words within a sentence and sentences within a paragraph

Introduction

These types of tools are useful for quickly preparing activities around texts within any curriculum area. Activities that scramble words in a sentence, or sentences in a paragraph, are most suitable for more advanced EAL learners who are reading competently. It is also important that the topic is familiar to the learners. Some tools offer a degree of control over the output in terms of degree of difficulty. These tools also provide a simple way to convert the activity into a worksheet.

Original sentence (taken from a concluding paragraph of a balanced argument)

Firstly, no dam can control flooding, provide irrigation and also generate electricity as claimed by the builders.

Note: It is possible to set the level of difficulty to meet the level of proficiency in English of each individual EAL learner (as well as non-EAL peers). In the image below the output has been set to 25% difficulty. The 3 versions below illustrate how the difficulty setting affects the rendered text.

Note: By default, this tool chooses to cut the text up on the basis of where the full stops occur in the text. This makes the activity a little easier for most children. However, if you wanted to have more manual control you could cut the text up in different places by entering a cursor return between the ‘sentences’ and then rearranging them before scrambling. With a bit of effort, you can make the activity more challenging and additionally focus on specific elements like:

- punctuation
- conjunctions
- adverbial phrases
